

# Covered In Hope



Five inch squares seem to be a staple in my stash. This is usually the size I start with when attacking a pile of scrap. This quilt is another version of a “charm” quilt. The consistent sashing in a neutral fabric and consistent cornerstones help to calm the scrappiness. You could do the cornerstones in scraps, too, if you were in a really scrappy mood.

**Finished Size: 49.5” x 61.5”**

## Fabric/Cut:

63 - 5” squares from scraps or two charm packs

Sashing - 1 yard                      Cut 17 - 2” strips. Subcut into 134 - 5” pieces.

Cornerstones -  $\frac{1}{4}$  yard              Cut 4 - 2” strips. Subcut into 80 - 2” squares.

Border:  $\frac{5}{8}$  yard                      Cut 6 - 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ ” strips.

## Sew:

Make 9 rows of alternating sashing and scrap squares as shown.

Make 10 rows of alternating cornerstones and sashing as shown.

Sew rows together starting with a cornerstone/sashing row and alternating with sashing/square rows.,

Add border
